Throughout The Odyssey, the protagonist Odysseus endures many barriers, one of which is Calypso (the concealer). Calypso, a beautiful goddess-nymph, who makes her home on the Island of Ogygia, is one of the obstacles Odysseus faces on his return to Ithaca.
