National Air Toxics Information Clearinghouse

The National Air Toxics Information Clearinghouse (NATIC) is a program administered by the **Environmental Protection Agency** (EPA). This information network was developed by the EPA to provide state and federal **air pollution control** experts with **air pollution** data. The computerized data base is headquartered in North Carolina, but **air pollution control** officers nationwide are able to access the data.

NATIC is a "one-stop shop" for emissions data for state enforcement officers, according to the EPA. Included on the network is information on air toxics programs, **ambient air** quality standards, **pollution** research, non-health related impact of air pollution, permits, emissions inventories, and ambient **air quality** monitoring programs.
